



Substitute School Nurse

The substitute school nurse works at Canterbury on a temporary basis when the full-time nurse is absent. The primary role is to provide primary health and emergency care to students, promote wellness and serve as a resource for health concerns in the school setting. While working, duties are similar to those of a full-time nurse: you assess the health of students and treat minor illnesses and injuries. A school nurse is involved in evaluating and managing physical problems, but your responsibilities may also include helping students with emotional, mental, or social issues.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Hold current Indiana State license as a Registered Nurse, current certification in CPR
- Excellent communication skills and computer skills
- Knowledge of current practices for common childhood illnesses and chronic diseases
- Ability to perform skilled nursing care and exercise professional judgment in making decisions
- May require a valid residential driver's license with a safe driving record.

DESIRABLE QUALIFICATIONS:

- Baccalaureate degree in nursing or related field
- Experience in pediatric and/or community or public health nursing
- Prior experience in school nursing, or acute care setting

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Provides care for student and staff illness and accidents on both campuses
- Coordinate but not administer essential student medications.
- Record accurately services rendered and to interpret and explain reports, health care plans and medical interventions.
- Follows communicable disease control procedures and informs administration and/or parents regarding school exclusion and readmission.
